The Problem:

The normals/recommendedfeedingregimefor horses in training to provide 'hard feeds' 2/3 times daily and supply small amounts of forage (e.g. hay)

However despitethese feedingchanges the horse continues to produce a constant flow of gastic acid

Acidity increas es to such a level it can cause "splashback" at the stomach
